### Peace-Building by Interreligious Dialogue.

In this talk will be given a portrait of Ghana's situation as an ethnically diverse, politically divided and religiously plural nation. He sees diversity as the fundamental issue for conflict prevention, peace and reconciliation. How can we be tolerant and co-exist peacefully, without giving up our group values and interests? Which initiatives are promoting people? How do the churches focus on equipping young people with conflict management skills?

### Housing, working and living in the inner city: the struggles for the right to the city in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil

The beaches of Copacabana and Ipanema, Sugar Loaf Mountain and Corcovado, Carnival, soccer in the Maracanã stadium and the diversity of music - Rio de Janeiro is a popular destination for tourists. But how does the city and its development look from the perspective of its inhabitants, especially the poorer population? Orlando Alves dos Santos will present the project "Living, working and living in the city center of Rio de Janeiro", which was jointly implemented by researchers, students and activists. The project addresses the process of urban restructuring in the inner city of Rio de Janeiro, that has as its characteristics the privatization and elitization of certain portions of the territory, accompanied by the intensification of urban control policies. Since the central area is a region historically occupied by the popular classes, these processes of urban development are having violent impacts on this population that lives and circulates in the center, depending on it for its own social reproduction.

## **Die Folgen des Ukraine-Krieges für Migration und Integration.**

### **Eine erste Einschätzung**

Yuliya Kosyakova stellt einen Forschungsbericht vor, den das Institut für Arbeitsmarkt- und Berufsforschung (IAB) in Nürnberg kurz nach Ausbruch des Ukraine-Krieges veröffentlicht hat. Darin werden die Folgen des Kriegs auf das Migrations- und Integrationsgeschehen in Deutschland beleuchtet und diskutiert.

Aufbauend auf den Erfahrungen der Integration anderer Geflüchteter, sollte die Integration durch Sprach- und Arbeitsmarktprogramme, eine schnelle Arbeitsmarktberatung und -vermittlung, die Anerkennung beruflicher Abschlüsse und den Erwerb weiterer Bildungsabschlüsse unterstützt werden. Vor dem Hintergrund des hohen Frauen- und Kinderanteils sind auch die schnelle Integration von Kindern und Jugendlichen in das Bildungssystem, breite Betreuungsangebote und das gezielte Angebot von Sprach- und Integrationsprogrammen für Frauen zentral.

## **The situation of Migrant Caregivers in Taiwan under non-governmental driven rules.**

Similarly to Germany, Taiwan has a rapidly aging population. Therefore Taiwan launched the long-term care plan 2.0 (2017-2026), which focuses on person-centered and community-based services. One of the intended aims is to offer a package of care following the ABC scheme: Integrated Community Service (A), Long-term Care Service Institution (B) and long-term care corner store (C). Despite the long-term care policy Taiwanese families still need migrant care workers to cover their demand. An unregulated market has emerged alongside the state system. The talk gives insights into the migrant caregivers working and living in Taiwan. Results of interviews with government social workers, caregivers and NGOs are included in the presentation.

- Chih-Bang Hsiao, Assistant Professor at the Asia University Taiwan, PhD in Germany. His teaching and research areas are Community social work, senior community caring and domestic violence.

## **The Role of Faith-based and Interreligious Actors to protect Refugee and Migrant Children**

Protecting refugee and migrant children requires multistakeholder collaboration and working across borders in complex political contexts. The contribution of faith based, and inter-religious communities and organizations can be vital to supporting children whose lives have been affected by forcible displacement or migration. The talk will emphasize the “From Faith to Action” initiative, which focuses on children escaping conflict, persecution, natural disaster, or poverty, and brings together UNICEF and stakeholders from faith-based communities who share the aspiration of providing support and protection: physically, psychologically, and spiritually.
